Columbia Heights Educational Campus's (CHEC) redesigned model will dramatically change the structure and flow of the school day. Master teachers will spend increased one-on-one time with students, while associate teachers will help students build proficiency across all subject areas.

Learning will flow from a Personalized Education Platform that assesses proficiency in real time, providing a spectrum of information that will help teachers finesse instructional techniques and students identify areas to focus on individually. This data-driven approach will help CHEC maintain its impressive accomplishments ( $85 \%$ of its graduates go on to college) while continuing to improve student proficiency.

CHEC also brings an international perspective to its curricula through an emphasis on global citizenship. Students engage with a variety of cultures through language immersion courses, internships, and study abroad programs.
